Authorizing the Mayor to submit an amended City of Mansfield's Consolidated Plan/Annual Action Plan for PY 2019-2020 to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development indicating proposed uses for the City's 2019-2020 Home Investment Partnership Program Funds, and Community Development Block Grant Funds (CDBG) under the provisions of Public Law 93-383, as amended, and declaring an emergency.

**WHEREAS**, Mansfield has been designated an "Entitlement City" and a "Participating Jurisdiction" by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), and such designations make the City eligible for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and Home Investment Partnership (HOME) funds, and

**WHEREAS**, a public hearing was held on August 16, 2021, concerning the City's proposed uses for HOME funds under the provision of Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, P.L. 93-383, as amended and Ordinance 21-076 and 21-077, was adopted to authorize the Mayor to submit an Annual Action Plan for FY 2020 Home Investment Partnership Program Funds, and

**WHEREAS**, from 2019 through 2020, the City received CDBG, HOME, funds that were designated throughout those years via Ordinances approved by City Council for certain approved projects but which remained in part or in whole unused, and

**WHEREAS**, the City's Community Development Department, through its HUD approved re-allocation program and Substantial Amendment process, is desirous of revising its previous re-allocation of such unused funds, and

**WHEREAS**, the purpose of this legislation is to reallocate, in conformity with the Community Development Department's Citizen Participation Plan and the City's Revised Re-allocation Program, a total of eighty-nine thousand seven hundred fifty-four and 00/100 dollars (\$89,754.00) in Community Development Block Grant Funds (CDBG); one hundred forty thousand and 00/100 dollars (\$140,000.00) in Home Investment Partnerships (HOME) funds; that were designated but unused for fiscal years 2019 through 2020 to newly designated projects as hereinafter indicated, and

**WHEREAS**, a notice, concerning the revised re-allocation of the CDBG funds under the provisions of Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, P.L. 930383, as amended, has been published, followed by a thirty (30) day comment period.

**SECTION I - Project Description**

WHEREAS, the State has identified the need for the described project:

*Signal upgrades at the intersection of US 42 and Grace Street*

This project is within the Mansfield Corporation Limits

Construction is tentatively scheduled to begin in CY2023.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City of Mansfield of Richland County, Ohio.

**SECTION II - Consent Statement**

Being in the public interest, the City gives consent to the Director of Transportation to complete the above described project.

- 2) *ODOT agrees to assume and bear on hundred percent (100%) of the roadway construction and construction engineering costs with the following exception: The city shall agree to assume and bear one hundred percent (100%) of the cost difference between the base bid and the cost of the alternate bid for the Iiteris video detection requested by the city. The estimated cost to the city is \$3,500.*

#### **SECTION IV - Maintenance**

Upon completion of the described Project, and unless otherwise agreed, the City shall:

- 1) provide adequate maintenance for the described Project in accordance with all applicable state and federal law;

- 3) maintain the right-of-way, keeping it free of obstructions; and hold said right-of-way inviolate for public highway purposes.

If city owned utilities, within a corporation limit or in a private easement outside corporation limits, need to be relocated due to this ODOT project, the city will be reimbursed for any relocation work; ODOT will perform the coordination, relocation, and reimbursement which shall comply with the current provisions of 23 CFR 645 and the ODOT Utilities Manual.

If other public and private utilities need to be relocated due to this ODOT project they will not be reimbursed for relocation; with exceptions due to an easement, etc.

Amending Sections 8, 9, 30, and 31 of Ordinance No. 21-192, adopting personnel positions, pay grades and salaries for certain employees of the City of Mansfield 2021 payroll year, to correct inadvertent errors and align Information Technology personnel with the AFSCME CBA, and declaring an emergency.

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Sections 1 through 38 of Ordinance No. 21-192, passed September 7, 2021, this Council adopted certain personnel positions, pay grades and salaries for certain employees of the City of Mansfield for the 2021 payroll year, and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Section 8 of said Ordinance no changes were made to the positions listed in the Information Technology Division, however, such changes have become necessary to align said Ordinance with the current AFSCME CBA, and

**WHEREAS**, due to inadvertent error in Section 9 the number of Project Planners in the Engineering Division was reduced from three to two, and

**WHEREAS**, due to inadvertent error a newly created position was placed in Section 30, rather than correctly in Section 31, and

**WHEREAS**, the purpose of this legislation is to align all positions with the AFSCME CBA and correct any errors.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MANSFIELD, STATE OF OHIO:**

**SECTION 1.** That Section 8 of Ordinance No. 21-192, passed September 7, 2021, be, and the same is hereby amended to read and provide as follows:
