Amending Section 505.17 of the Mansfield Codified Ordinances of 1997 concerning hunting and trapping in the City limits.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF MANSFIELD, STATE OF OHIO:**

SECTION 1. That Section 505.17 of the Mansfield Codified Ordinances of 1997, be, and the same is hereby, amended to read as follows:

"505.17 HUNTING AND TRAPPING PROHIBITED.

(a) No person shall trap, hunt, kill or attempt to kill any animal or fowl by the use of firearms, bow and arrow, air rifle or any other means within the corporate limits of the Municipality except as provided in Section 505.12.

(b) Notwithstanding section (a) generally, it shall be lawful for any person who is licensed as a commercial nuisance wild animal control operator under Ohio Revised Code § 1531.40 to trap or take live, wild animals that interfere with the use or enjoyment of property, cause a threat to public safety, or may cause damage or harm to a structure, property, or person.

(c) Whoever violates this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor."

SECTION 2. That this measure shall take effect and be in force after the earliest time allowed by law, after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

Authorizing the City of Mansfield to transfer to the Richland County Land Reutilization Corporation one (1) property known as "Ocie Hill Community Center," at 445 Bowman Street, Parcel Number 027-04-501-32-000, which no longer serves a public purpose, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, the property authorized for transfer herein is available to the City for transfer to the Richland County Land Reutilization Corporation, having been acquired by the City and no longer having a valid public purpose, which is unneeded and no longer required for City Purposes, and Ohio Revised Code 1724.10(B)(3) authorizes the City to convey said parcel without the advertising or receipt of bids.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF MANSFIELD, STATE OF OHIO:**

SECTION 1. That the City be, and is hereby, authorized to transfer the one (1) property known as "Ocie Hill Community Center," at 445 Bowman Street, Parcel Number 027-04-501-32-000, and to take all other actions and sign any documents necessary to complete said transfer of the property to the Richland County Land Reutilization Corporation.

SECTION 2. That for the purposes of identification, all necessary deeds and title searches are attached for the property being transferred.

SECTION 3. That by reason of the immediate necessity for conveying title to said property at the earliest possible time so as to take advantage of certain federal grant dollars and to thereby promote and continue redevelopment effort in the City of Mansfield, this measure is determined to be an emergency ordinance for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City of Mansfield and its inhabitants and providing it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect be in force immediately upon its adoption, otherwise from and after the earliest time allowed by law, after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

Amending Section 7 in Ordinance #21-217 (Benefits Ordinance), as amended, relating to retroactivity for City employees, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, Ordinance #21-217, passed October 19, 2021, as amended, is the last complete revision of the wages and salaries, fringe benefits and terms of employment of non-bargaining unit employees of the City, and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Ordinance is to amend said Ordinance retroactive to May 1, 2021 to align with the latest CBA.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF MANSFIELD, STATE OF OHIO:**

SECTION 1. That Section 7 in Ordinance #21-217 (Benefits Ordinance), as amended, be, and the same is hereby amended to read and provide as follows retroactive to May 1, 2021:

"SECTION 7. That by reason of the immediate necessity for establishing and implementing wages, salaries, fringe benefits, and terms of employment for certain non-collective bargaining unit employees, this measure is determined to be an emergency ordinance for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City of Mansfield and its inhabitants and providing it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force **retroactively to May 1, 2021** immediately upon its adoption, otherwise from and after the earliest time allowed by law, after its passage and approval by the Mayor."

SECTION 2. That by reason of the immediate necessity for implementing this change in the terms of employment for certain employees, this measure is determined to be an emergency Ordinance for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City of Mansfield and its inhabitants, and providing it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its adoption, otherwise from and after the earliest time allowed by law, after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

Amending Ordinance #17-113 Capital Projects Fund (#422), entitled "Capital Equipment Fund", for the purpose of accumulating funds, from the sale of unneeded equipment, to be used for future capital purchases to include all auctions instead of just internet auctions, and declaring an emergency.

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF MANSFIELD, STATE OF OHIO:**

SECTION 1. That Section 1 in Ordinance #17-113 Capital Projects Fund (#422), entitled "Capital Equipment Fund", a new capital projects fund (#422), entitled "Capital Equipment Fund," is hereby amended to read and provide as follows retroactive to January 1, 2021:

"SECTION 1. That a new capital projects fund (#422), entitled "Capital Equipment Fund," is hereby established for the purpose of accumulating funds, from the sale of unneeded equipment by means of ~~all an internet auctions~~, including internet auctions, to be used for future capital purchases of the selling department, all in accordance with ORC 5705.13 (c), and money deposited in this fund shall not accumulate for more than ten years prior to use."

SECTION 2. That for the purpose of proper and accurate accounting of received funds, this measure is determined to be an emergency Ordinance for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City of Mansfield and its inhabitants and providing it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its adoption, otherwise from and after the earliest time allowed by law, after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
