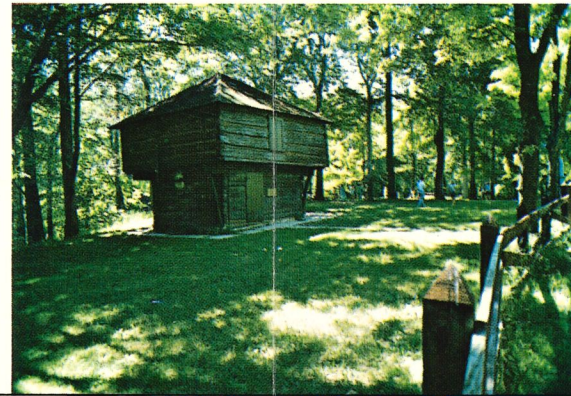




Mansfield was founded in 1808 by three surveyors who named the town after their employer, Jared Mansfield, Surveyor General of U. S. Mr. Mansfield also a mathematics professor at West Point, never visited the wilderness village that bore his name.

Better remembered in Mansfield history was John Chapman, pioneer nurseryman and frontier missionary. Known as Johnny Appleseed, he came to the village in 1810 and roamed the area for the next 25 years.

A monument to Johnny Appleseed is located in South Park near the city's historic blockhouse.

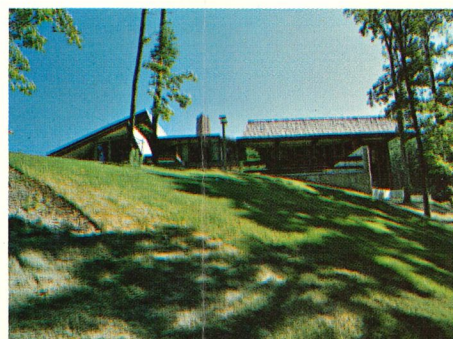
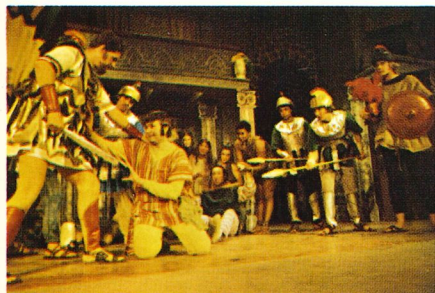

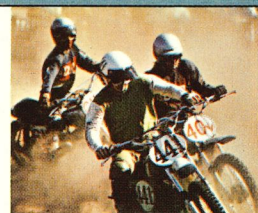
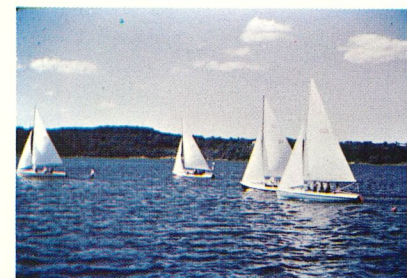
Mohican Lodge on Pleasant Hill Lake is Ohio's newest resort facility with miles of wooded trails and breathtaking views.

Nearly every faith is represented by the more than 200 churches, synagogues and temples.



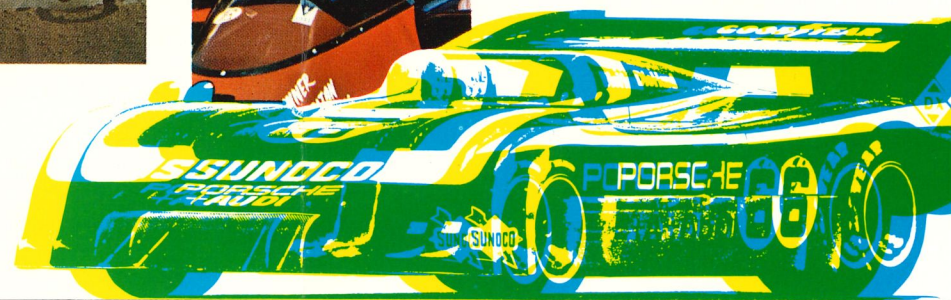
Golf is a popular Mansfield sport with three public 18 hole courses, an 18-hole par-three course, and the Westbrook Country Club.

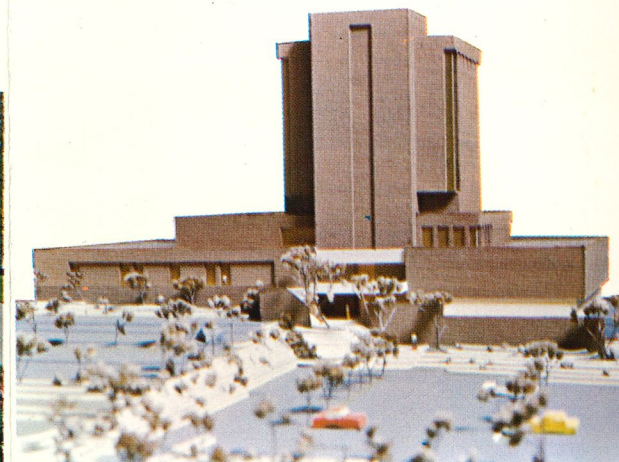
