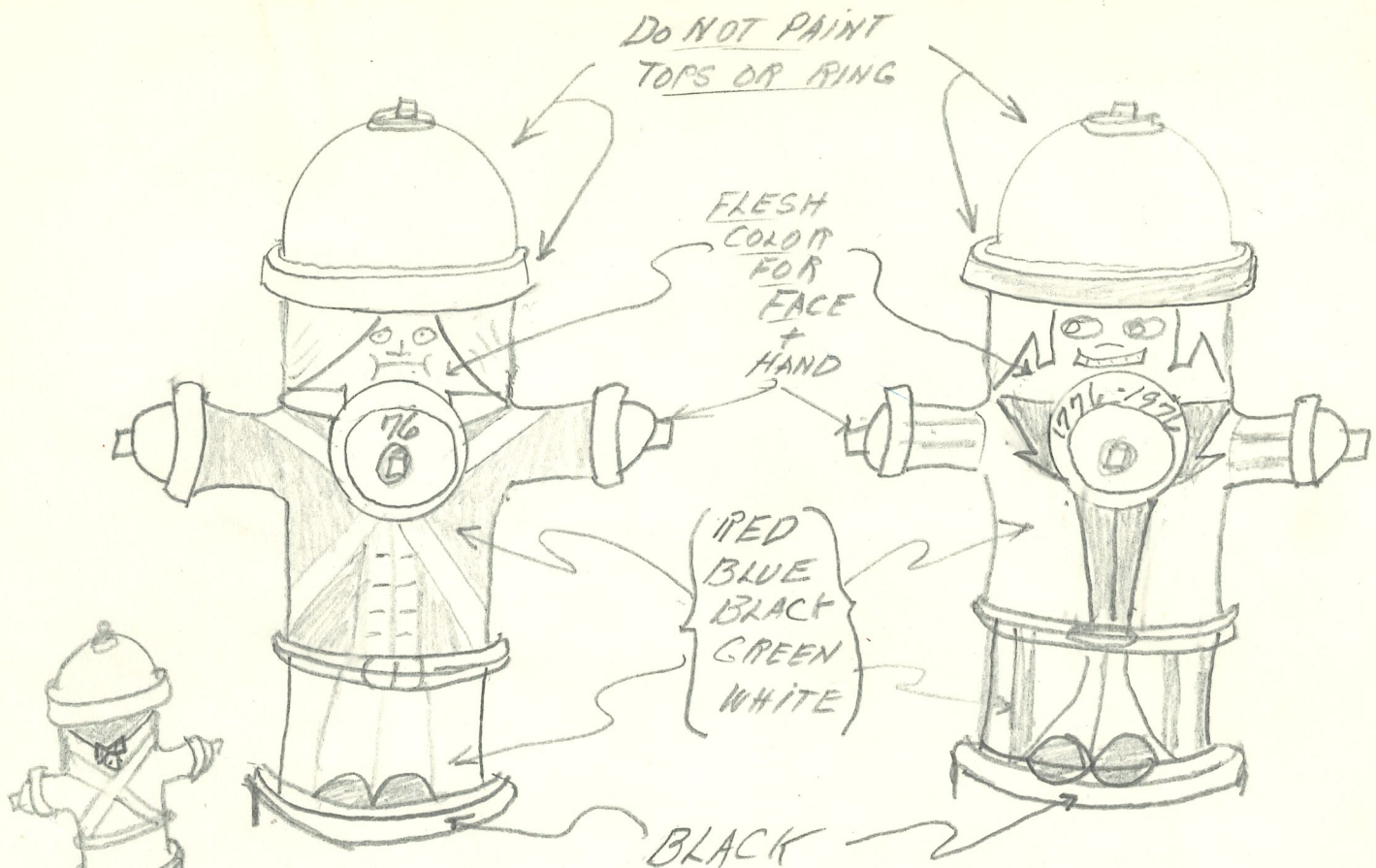

Painting Rules

Bicentennial fireplug "artists" are required to follow the rules of the city ordinance concerning the painting of fireplugs in the city, Albert L. Allen, chairman of the Bicentennial celebration, said today.

The ordinance requires the permission of the property owner living closest to the fireplug, Allen said.

Fireplug painters also must not paint the top of the fireplug or the band directly under the top. The top of the plug is painted with fluorescent paint to enable firemen to spot the fireplugs in the dark. The band underneath the top carries code numbers on water pressure.

Allen said the plugs also should not be painted dark colors so that they would blend with shrubbery.

Paint used on the fireplugs must be oil-based or acrylic.
